

News from South Ellis County Water Supply Corp.:

Boil Water Notice August 24, 2017

On August 24, 2017, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) required our public water system, **South Ellis County Water Supply Corp., PWS ID 0 7000 43** to issue a **Boil Water Notice (BWN)**. This is to inform our members/customers that due to a line break which has caused low water pressure and water outages in the following areas:

Cosby Rd; West/East Hwy 22, Milford; NWCR 4370; FM 308, Mertens; Richland Bend; and FM 308, Milford

Customers whose service address is listed above should boil the water from our system prior to consumption.

To ensure destruction of all harmful bacteria and other microbes, water for drinking, cooking, and making ice should be boiled and cooled prior to use. The water should be brought to a vigorous, rolling boil and then boiled for two minutes. In lieu of boiling, you may purchase bottled water or obtain water from some other suitable source.

When it is no longer necessary to boil the water, the water system officials will notify you that the water is safe for consumption. Instructions to discontinue boiling will be issued in the same manner as this notice.
